
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# **Religious Education News**

## **APPLICATION FOR EXTENDED LEAVE**

Parents, as you know, it is very important that children attend school every day. Quite often leave is requested by parents for various reasons. While we understand that this may be necessary sometimes, it is not encouraged. **Every school day is important for every student**.

If you intend taking your child out of the school for **five days or more** you must make a formal application to the Principal in writing by completing the **'Application for Extended Leave' form** which is available from the school office. The application must be **submitted at least 4 weeks prior to the expected leave** or earlier if possible.

It is important for parents to know that, depending on circumstances, this leave may not be approved. Each application will be considered on an individual basis and could depend on circumstances such as the intention for the leave, your child's attendance and the impact the leave may have on your child's academic progress.

These regulations are in place in all schools in the Parramatta Diocese to make sure that all students have the best opportunity to achieve to their full potential. We appreciate your support and understanding of these requirements.

## **Developing Successful Reading at Home**

For a couple of weeks now, students have been using their Reading Log books to record their reading for Homework. **Reading as our central focus for homework is a general mind-shift for both students as well as parents in terms of homework. Reading has often been seen as an 'extra', taken for granted, that is expected as part of homework, where now it is our central focus.** 

In setting reading as our central focus we aim to: develop rigorous daily reading habits, an awareness of the breadth of texts that are available to access as well as students coming to know what texts they particularly enjoy, build skills in deciphering text as well as comprehend challenging texts. And in developing these, we aim build in our students independence and proficiency in all forms of reading, but more importantly, to nurture a love of reading which will go with them into their adutlhood.

One of the first things I ask my students when we meet as a group is "When and where are you reading at home?" What I am looking for is a reading habit forming: a regular time of day where students read as well as a place where they are also comfortable to read. It is vital that students have a say in these things so that they find their own niche that works for them. Alarm bells ring when students say that they read whenever they have time to fit it in. Adhoc reading will remain just that, until a student finds their groove for a best time and place. This is also true for text genre. *Students who say that there are no books or texts that they find interesting need to say 'I have not found any books YET that I'm attracted to." Finding the right combination of time, space and content takes a bit of time, advice and input from competent readers (adults and teachers), perseverance and trial and error. But it is important.* 

## Some Quick Ideas to Help Reading for Parents

Buy your child a safe bed lamp and encourage the routine of reading in bed before lights-out. Give books as presents and show your child how to care for them - books are forever! Find a common book or text to read to each other when you can.

How often does your child see you read? Modelling a joy of reading is very important. What we value is often what our children do too.
