Schools have Leadership Teams who support the Principal in the work of leading the school. My endless thanks to the teachers who have been a part of these teams over the years. They have kept the focus on improving outcomes for the students of SJV and have never let our postcode determine our success. As they say there is no 'I' in team and I could not have done it without the team.

The staff at SJV are second to none! A school could have no greater compliment than for its own staff members to send their children and grandchildren to the school. All the staff at SJV work extremely hard everyday to make sure the students receive a great education. Thank you to all the staff I have worked with, some of whom were here when I arrived and some have been here since the opening of the *school*.


KINDERCARE LEARNING CENTRE BEFORE and AFTER SCHOOL PICKUP & DROP OFF DAILY SERVICE
