In all areas of testing (Reading, Writing, Language Conventions and Numeracy) the school average in both Year 3 and Year 5 was better than the national average!

In the 10 areas tested across Years 3 & 5 our school had a greater percentage of students in the top three bands compared to Diocesan schools and State schools in 8 areas!

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

August has brought us a number of important feast days and the 15th August was the Feast of the Assumption. This feast day commemorates Mary's body and soul being assumed into heaven and was also a time for us to reflect on the kind of life and person that Mary was and learn from her example.




