### **SCHOOL ATTENDANCE**

At St John Vianney's Parish school, we continue to promote student attendance. Thank you to our parents for the support and value that you place on your child being at school each day.

Below are the current attendance levels per Grade:

Kindy: ↓ 83.5% Year 1: ↑ 87.9% Year 2: ↑ 84.7& Year 3: ↑ 93%

Year 4: ↓ 79.2% Year 5: ↑ 81.8% Year 6: 79.8% same

- > Regular school attendance plays a critical role in ensuring that every student has access to the same learning opportunities.
- ➤ When students are not at school, are late to school or leave school early, they are missing out on so much that can impact on their future learning.
- As you can see our current school average is 84.6% which is well below our target of 90%.
- We <u>love</u> seeing you at school and ready for learning. Let's make regular school attendance a priority for <u>every</u> family.

### **APPLICATION FOR EXTENDED LEAVE**

Parents, as you know, it is very important that children attend school every day. Quite often leave is requested by parents for various reasons. While we understand that this may be necessary sometimes, it is not encouraged. Every school day is important for every student.

If you intend taking your child out of the school for **five days or more** you must make a <u>formal application to the Principal</u> <u>in writing</u> and also complete the '**Application for Extended Leave' form** which is available from the school office. The application must be **submitted at least 4 weeks prior to the expected leave** or earlier if possible.

It is important for parents to know that, depending on circumstances, this leave may not be approved. Each application will be considered on an individual basis and could depend on circumstances such as the intention for the leave, your child's attendance and the impact the leave may have on your child's academic progress.

These regulations are in place in all schools in the Parramatta Diocese to make sure that all students have the best opportunity to achieve to their full potential. We appreciate your support and understanding of these requirements.

### **MEDICATION**

If your child requires medication during the day, e.g. antibiotics, please send a note to the office together with the medication, details of dosage and time to be administered. If medication is required for a period of 5 days or more, a form will be sent home for completion. Just a reminder that NO MEDICATION is to be in your child's school bag. All medication must be kept in the office as we need to record all medication given to students.

The School's First Aid Officer requires updated copies of all Asthma Management Plans and Anaphylaxis Action Plans so that we are prepared to help your child in case of an emergency.



### Finding Space in Our Lives for Literacy - Audiobooks

All too often when I talk to students about what they are reading at home they say that they didn't have the time. Soccer training, family commitments, helping with odd jobs around the house - our lives are very full and days and nights fly by so quickly we often end up wondering where the time has gone.

As our children need regular exposure to reading in their everyday lives to develop sound proficiency, we sometimes scratch our heads and wonder how we can find more time? Most students find an enjoyable and workable routine around their bedtime, as reading becomes ingrained in their daily settling into sleep. But not all students find this achievable as they may be getting to sleep quite late or are too fatigued by that time of the evening.

### One answer to this could be Audiobooks.

An audiobook is a recording of a reading of a book such as a novel and there are many thousands available from many sources such as **iTunes or Audible**. Students can access free audiobooks to listen to from the 'elibrary' link from the classm8 login page. Instructions of how to do this can be found on the student Home Reading Log-book.

Audiobooks can be listened to while driving or going for a walk, or when involved in any activity that requires little concentration. There is an argument though that listening to an Audiobook is not reading and that it should be designated to the realm of entertainment. **But there are many literary benefits of plugging into a good audiobook.** 

### Audibooks:

- Introduce students to books above their reading level
- Model good interpretive reading
- Teach critical listening
- Highlight the humor in books
- Introduce new genres that students might not otherwise consider
- Introduce new vocabulary or difficult proper names or locales
- Provide a read-aloud model
- Provide a bridge to important topics of discussion for parents and children who can listen together while commuting to sporting events, music lessons, or on vacations
- Recapture "the essence and the delights of hearing stories beautifully told by extraordinarily talented storytellers"

Additionally, many audiobooks are read by the author or include commentary by the author. This information can provide students with a connection to the author as well as insight into the author's thoughts and the writing process.

Even with all the benefits of audiobooks, however, they are not for all students. For some, the pace may be too fast or too slow. For others, the narrator's voice can be irritating or the use of cassette or CD players can be cumbersome when compared to the flexibility of the book. But *the majority of students will find listening to well-narrated, quality literature to be a transformative experience.* 

And the other thing - for the first time, when you're sitting in traffic, you may be actually happy that you have time to listen to the rest of the chapter!



It is a system requirement that child protection training be completed by all volunteers commencing work in our school and a briefing every second year for existing volunteers.
