The Feast Days of St. John Vianney and St. Mary of the Cross MacKillop, the 4th and 8th August are two very special dates for our school community here at St. John Vianney's Parish School. Friday 4th August is the Feast Day of St. John Vianney, the Patron Saint of our Parish and school and the Patron Saint of all Parish Priests. St. John Vianney's life is a clear example of a special person who responded to God's call to bringing the Good News of God's forgiving love through not only his words but also his actions.

Words Words Words All Around US! The Amazing World of Vocabulary

Studies have shown that mastering an extensive vocabulary is one of the most significant contributors to perception of intelligence, is an accurate predictor of academic achievement and has also been linked to future employment success.

Complex vocabulary is developed through exposure as well as the opportunity to make meaning. The average Year Three student knows 15,000 words. The average Year Six student knows 50,000 words. So, **students are learning 3000 - 4000 words a year** or 10 words a day - every day of the year. Children are also very capable of understanding complex words if given the opportunity to place them within a context, discuss them and repeat them. We should not 'dumb down' language. This robs children of the opportunity to explore and broaden their vocabulary. What is needed is often to associate a complex word with a similar one and within a sentence that gives it meaning: For example, (upon hearing a loud noise) "That was a tremendous noise wasn't it? It was so loud and huge?"

This is true for writing too. Unfortunately (long ago), I happened to hear a teacher say to a student who was having trouble spelling a word, choose a different easier word to spell. Words are the bricks with which we build our meaning and the colours with which that we paint our world in language. We should never settle for dulling a colour down.

What can we do to help work out tricky words??

When we come across a difficult word we can talk about the 'outside' and 'inside' clues in which we can help work out the meaning of a word.

The 'outside' clues are the context of the sentence and passage that it is written. What makes a sentence? What words are around it, give clues as to what it could mean? Is there an illustration, diagram or other image which relates to the sentence and word?

The 'inside' clues are the parts of the word that we can make sense of.

Is there a base word that helps give meaning? eg: *inspirational* - you can see that the word *inspire* is the base word. So 'inspirational' relates to something that inspires.

Morphemes are parts of words that make meaning such as preffixes and suffixes. Children are very in tune to how these change the meaning of words. eg: by adding 'ed' to walk, it becomes past tense - walked. So by breaking up a word, we can try to make out what it could mean.

So...

Lots of new tricky words are great - and the chance to make sense of them!






Dear Parents and Carers,

Listed below are some helpful tips to use to help your child see how you use maths in everyday life. For example;

- Explore how you use fractions in cooking; percentages while shopping; distance in driving; keeping score in sports games and telling the time.
- Try asking them to work out how many pieces they will need to cut the birthday cake into so that everyone has a slice.
- Work out the actual cost of discounted items e.g. 25% off \$20
- Figure out when you will arrive at a destination e.g. "It is 4:15 pm now. It will take us 30 minutes to get home, what time will we arrive?"
- If your child is struggling to work it out, suggest they show you on paper or talk you through how they are trying to work it out so you can help them. Remember to use the 'Problem Solving Steps to Success' listed below.

Maths is a learned skill that improves with practice. <u>Talk positively about</u> maths and encourage your child to practise as much as possible as part of a regular routine.


