CAPABILITIES to Help Children Develop into Life-long Learners

(cont. from last newsletter)

Education and child development, as integrated processes, are nurtured mainly through the collaborative efforts of parents and teachers.

In the last newsletter, I shared four of eight capabilities that we can help to develop in our children, so they grow into lifelong learners. **The first of these were: Resilience, Self-Awareness, Curiosity and Sociability.** This week I will share some insights about the last four.

Integrity-the ability to act consistently with the values, beliefs, and principles that we hold. It's about courage, honesty, and respect in one's daily interactions -- and doing the right thing even when no one is watching. We shape children's integrity by treating them with respect and dignity and listening to their feelings and concerns without judgment. When we praise students for demonstrating their values, beliefs, and principles through actions, we remind them of their value as ethical human beings.

Resourcefulness- the ability to find and use available resources to achieve goals, problem solve, and shape the future. It draws on skills like planning, goal setting, strategic thinking, and organizing. We encourage students to be resourceful when we set high expectations and support them to achieve their goals. When we teach them to be strategic thinkers and adaptable problem solvers, they learn to live without rigid rules or preconceived ideas.

Creativity- the ability to generate and communicate original ideas and appreciate the nature of beauty. It fosters imagination, innovation, and a sense of aesthetics. We inspire creativity when we encourage young people to express themselves through writing, poetry, acting, photography, art, digital media, unstructured play, etc. When we notice and praise them for thinking outside the box and taking risks, their imaginations blossom.

Empathy-the ability to recognize, feel, and respond to the needs and suffering of others. It enables and assists the expression of caring, compassion, and kindness. We influence children's abilities to care for others beyond themselves by creating meaningful relationships with them, ensuring that they are seen, felt, and understood regardless of how they learn.

Dear Parents,

Fractions, decimals and percentages are mathematical concepts taught throughout primary school and beyond. We may see and use them inadvertently in everyday life.

What is a fraction?

Fractions are used to represent smaller pieces (or parts) of a whole.

The parts might make up one thing, or more than one thing. Either way, altogether, they make up what's called a whole.

It's important to note that a whole can mean more than one thing, and it's useful to think of a sweet shop as an analogy.

For sharing a singular whole amount, you can think of a chocolate bar, a cake bar, or muffin.

For grouping an amount into fractional parts, you can imagine a bag of sweets – there are lots of sweets in the bag, but you need all of them to make up the whole bag.

What is a decimal?

It can be hard to know how to explain decimals to a child, but here is a simple answer:

A decimal is a way of writing a number that is not a whole number.

They are used to write 'in between' numbers. An example would be 9.4 as it is more than 9, but less than 10.

What is a percentage?

A <u>percentage</u> is a number expressed as a fraction of 100. When talking about percentages, we imagine that 'a whole' has been divided into 100 equal parts.

Here are some examples of activities and resources you can use at home to encourage your child to develop their knowledge and skills in fractions, decimals and percentages.

Last year, 1 out of 7 of Vince's friends learnt how to ride bikes, while 15% of Anita's friends learnt how to ride bikes. Who had a greater percentage of friends who learnt how to ride bikes last year?

What number is $\frac{1}{6}$ of 12?




